## **CITY COUNCIL'S MESSAGE:**

Prior to the start of the March 29 City Council meeting, Council and members of the public honored past City Clerk Terry Tighe with a moment of silence. Mrs. Tighe worked in Sea Isle's Office of the City Clerk for 38 years prior to her retirement in 2008. She passed on March 17, 2016 leaving a void that will be difficult to fill.

Also during the March 29 meeting, City Council adopted the 2016 Municipal Budget, with the amount to be raised by taxation of \$16,936,675.69. There had been discussion throughout the budget process regarding use of the Water & Sewer surplus funds to offset the current fund budget and reduce the tax increase. The Administration strongly encouraged Council not to move the funds but recommended adopting the budget and agreed to present ways to use the surplus to reduce debt. The Council agreed to take an active role and looks forward to the Administration's presentation at the April 26 meeting.

Each item on the March 29 Consent Agenda was approved by City Council, including Resolution No. 056 that authorizes award of a contract for improvements to the exterior of the public works building at 80<sup>th</sup> Street. The Administrator explained these repairs are much needed for the 40 year old facility.

During the "Pending Business" portion of the meeting, Council Vice-President Tighe indicated that at the last meeting Council asked the City Solicitor for a draft ordinance regarding Floor Area Ratio (FAR) and language as to what may be included in the calculation of FAR. She explained that the discussion will continue at a future meeting when the full Council will be present.

The Administrator reported that the County has over the past several weeks been performing maintenance on drainage systems along Landis Avenue. Additionally, the City has a project in the design phase to help alleviate drainage issues and tidal infiltration at 46<sup>th</sup> Street.

The next City Council meeting is Tuesday, April 12, 2016 at 10:00 a.m.

## **PROJECT UPDATES:**

### **Beach Replenishment**

Additional refilling of beaches eroded by recent storms is in progress, with work completed from 25<sup>th</sup> to 50<sup>th</sup> Street. The dredge has been moved to safe harbor in anticipation of rough seas over the next couple days, with beach fill work expected to resume this coming weekend. The refill project will continue southward to 57<sup>th</sup> Street, and is expected to be completed within the next two weeks. In addition, dune fence and beach crossovers damaged by storms will also be repaired. The photos below of the 45<sup>th</sup> Street Beach were taken on March 29...



### **Utility Reconstruction, 36<sup>th</sup> & 37<sup>th</sup> Streets (Autumn 2015 construction)**

On March 26, 2015 City Council awarded a bid to Garden State General Construction in the amount of \$431,353.40 for the utility reconstruction of 36<sup>th</sup> Street & 37<sup>th</sup> Street from Cini Street to Landis Avenue. As of this date, all work has been completed. Due to the inclement weather over the winter, the area did not have sufficient time to settle, therefore, the City will reconstruct the streets in early fall.

### **Utility Reconstruction, various streets**

On October 27, 2015, City Council awarded a bid to RTW Construction of Southhampton, New Jersey, in the amount of \$744,713 for utility reconstruction at the following locations:

- 47<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Promenade – underway
- 49<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Promenade – underway
- 65<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Central Avenue
- 65<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Pleasure Avenue – substantially completed.
- 69<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Central Avenue
- 76<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Pleasure Avenue

Work to install new sanitary main, sanitary laterals, new water main and water services on 47<sup>th</sup> is under way. Initial work to install new water main & sanitary main on 49<sup>th</sup> is completed. Sanitary main with new laterals completed on 65<sup>th</sup> from Pleasure Avenue to Landis Avenue. Initial work to install new water main on 69<sup>th</sup> Street is completed. As the new water mains pass various testing, work will continue to progress to reconstruct water services and sewer laterals to the individual homes on those streets. ## **Roadway Reconstruction Program, various streets**

On March 15, 2016, City Council awarded a bid to Ricky Slade Construction, Inc., of Bridgeton New Jersey, in the amount of \$299,437.50 for road reconstruction at the following locations:


- 44<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade
- 46<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade
- 56<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade
- Roadway elevation on selected areas of 44<sup>th</sup> Street and Venicean Road

This project is slated to be completed before the summer season, however, the contract includes a suspension notice that no work can be done from mid-June until September 16, 2016. Storm improvements have been completed on 56<sup>th</sup> Street which will be followed by ADA sidewalks and curbing. ## **Bulkhead Construction, 80<sup>th</sup> Street and 93<sup>rd</sup> Street**

On August 25, 2015, City Council awarded a contract to Colonnelli Brothers, Inc., of Hackensack, New Jersey, in the amount of \$199,880 for the construction of bulkheads at the above locations. Larsen Marine, Inc. has been hired as a subcontractor. After some delays, the mobilization of this project occurred on March 15. The 93<sup>rd</sup> Street location is half-completed. Concrete and roadway restoration will begin after sufficient settlement time has elapsed. The completion date of this contract has been extended to April 29, 2016. ### **Sea Isle Boulevard (no change from last update)**

The Cape May County Board of Chosen Freeholders, at their May 13, 2014 meeting, awarded a \$12.7 million contract to South State, Inc. for the Sea Isle Boulevard Improvement project that will raise the roadway by approximately 4.5-feet and otherwise reconstruct Sea Isle Boulevard. Traffic has been diverted to the south side of the boulevard; and the contractor has placed fill on the north side of the causeway to an average height of about 6.5-feet, which is 2 feet higher than the eventual height of the completed roadway. The additional 2-feet, which will be removed prior to the next construction phase, is surcharge to compress the underlying layers of soil. The goal is to obtain as much settlement as possible prior to paving on top of the new fill. Now that this initial phase of fill placement is completed, the project will be dormant except for some maintenance activities such as cleaning accumulating sand in the diversionary roadway, and taking measurements to determine the amount of settlement that is occurring.

Motorists are advised to be aware of the revised traffic patterns in the construction zone and the reduced speed limit. There are no activities planned for Sea Isle Boulevard until next spring with the exception of the County Road Department mowing the south side.

### **Streetscape Improvement on Landis Avenue**

On September 8, 2015, City Council awarded a bid to Think Pavers Hardscaping, of Swedesboro, NJ, in the amount of \$796,648.33 for streetscape improvements on Landis Avenue from 43<sup>rd</sup> Street to 39<sup>th</sup> Street. This project includes various aspects of beautification, which includes new sidewalks, paver crosswalks, traffic striping, lighting, sod, stone mulching, various tree plantings & tree grates, benches and bike racks. The block from JFK Boulevard to 40<sup>th</sup> Street was previously completed as part of the JFK Gateway Project.

Hardscape improvements and lighting improvements from 39<sup>th</sup> Street to 40<sup>th</sup> Street are completed, both east and west sides of Landis, as is the new crosswalk at 39<sup>th</sup> & Landis. Street tree installation will take place in the next several weeks. The contractor has begun work south of JFK Boulevard on the west side of Landis with concrete being completed. The east side demolition has begun. Once both sides of Landis are completed to 43<sup>rd</sup> Street, crosswalks at 42<sup>nd</sup> & West Jersey Avenue will be constructed. In order to complete the streetscape intersections, intermittent closing of the intersections along Landis Avenue from West Jersey to 43<sup>rd</sup> Street will be necessary between now and early May. Notification and coordination with adjacent residents and businesses will take place in advance. The photos below of the 4100 block of Landis Avenue were taken on March 29...



### **Public Works Maintenance Garage at 80<sup>th</sup> Street & Central Avenue**

On March 23, 2016, City Council awarded a bid to Archetto Construction, of Vineland, NJ, to replace the roof, siding and insulation at this location. Work will commence once all permits are in place and materials have been secured.

### **Townsend's Inlet Bridge**

The TI Bridge was opened to traffic prior to Polar Bear Plunge Weekend, and remains open.

### **MASTER PLAN RE-EXAMINATION:**

The Planning Board held a special meeting to discuss the Recreation portion of the Master Plan Re-Examination on March 21, at which time the Board reviewed a report from our Recreation Committee and considered input from the City's Division of Recreation and members of the public. The final Recreation recommendations from that meeting are being compiled.

Also on March 21, based on public feedback, the Planning Board indicated their intention to recommend that the former Public School on Park Road remain a recreation facility. The Planning Board recommends that the City hire an engineering firm to determine the needs of the Park Road parcel in order to reach our recreation goals.

Another special Planning Board meeting will take place at 7:00 p.m. on April 18 in City Hall to discuss the last two sections of the Master Plan Re-Examination: Storm Water Management and Economic Development. As always, the public is invited to attend all Planning Board meetings.

## **FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING:**

During the months of April and May, Sea Isle City's Water Department will flush-out fire hydrants throughout town. Annual hydrant flushing is required by State law and ensures that hydrant systems are functioning properly (thus providing adequate water flow when needed). Residents can expect very little disruption in their water service - if any. However, low water pressure and possible water discoloration may occur. In the event of discoloration, simply allow water to run from the tap for a short while until clear. **Curbside trash and recycling collections** currently take place once each week on the following streets:

1st to 44th Street = Wednesdays

45th to 70th Street = Mondays

71st to 94th Street = Tuesdays

**Don't Forget:** The City will not collect carpeting or other construction materials, propane tanks, tires or batteries. Sea Isle City is a Single Stream Recycling Community, which means residents can combine all of their recyclable materials (paper, cans, glass and plastics) in one curbside collection bin. Recycling is not just a good idea...it's the law in Sea Isle City.

**Sea Isle City's Trash and Recycling Depot**, located next to the Bridge on JFK Boulevard, is open seven days a week (7:15 a.m. - 2:45 p.m.). The Depot will be closed on holidays (except New Year's Day, Presidents Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day and Labor Day). The Depot will accept drop-offs of trash and recycling, however Bulk Trash is not accepted at that location. **Free Refrigerator Magnets** with a complete list of Sea Isle City's year-round trash and recycling information are now available at the Public Works Building, 3905 Central Avenue, and at the Welcome Center, 300 JFK Boulevard.
