From The City of Sea Isle City, New Jersey

MAYOR'S MESSAGE:

Great news! Sea Isle City is slated to receive a grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation in the amount of \$179,000 to help resurface Pleasure Avenue from JFK Boulevard to 53rd Street (a project that will also include upgrading the ADA ramps at each intersection). The grant will come from the DOT's Municipal Aid Program, which is a very competitive funding program that received 641 applications requesting more than \$253 million this year alone. To put that into better perspective, there is only roughly \$79 million available from the Transportation Trust Fund. That being said, we are very happy to receive this money; and we anticipate that the Pleasure Avenue paving project will take place in the autumn of 2017.

Each spring, Sea Isle City is a hub of activity. Everywhere you turn, property owners are opening their homes in anticipation of the approaching warm weather, local businesses are preparing to welcome seasonal visitors, and City employees are readying our town for another event-filled summer. It truly is an exciting time of year.

Even though Sea Isle's springtime Calendar of Events is not as busy as our summer calendar, there are several notable happenings taking place in the weeks ahead that are worth mentioning, including the Chamber of Commerce and Revitalization's annual Spring Girls Weekend on April 22, 23 and 24, when you'll find special offers and discounts at participating businesses throughout town. Additionally, Sea Isle's Volunteer Ambulance Corps will host their 2016 Spring Arts & Crafts Fair in the public school gymnasium on April 23 and 24, and the Catholic Daughters of Saint Joseph Church will host a charity fundraiser on Saturday, April 23, featuring a lively musical performance by The Shaken Not Stirred Players. Then, join us at the Sea Isle City Library on Wednesday, April 27, for the official opening of the Historical Society's updated Memorial Garden, which will have several new enhancements, including an attractive water feature and two new turtle habitats, where nesting Diamondback Terrapin Turtles can lay their eggs.

Spring is definitely an exciting time to be in Sea Isle City – but just wait until you see our summer line-up of events and activities! We have a lot planned for you and your family this year, so be sure to spend as much time here as possible. As always, Sea Isle's Visitors Website, www.VisitSICNJ.com, is where you can learn what's happening in your favorite shore community. If you have questions regarding any events taking place during 2016, stop by the Welcome Center on JFK Boulevard or phone the Tourism Office at 263-8687.

Before closing, I would like to alert everyone about an important event that's taking place at 12 noon on April 24 at The Philadelphia Vietnam Veterans Memorial, where a special ceremony will be held to dedicate a larger-than-life statue of Corporal Michael Crescenz. Corporal Crescenz was a Cardinal Dougherty graduate who spent the summers of his youth here in Sea Isle City. The only Philadelphian who received the Medal of

Honor for heroism during the Vietnam War, he died on November 20, 1968, while silencing three machine gun bunkers and saving the lives of many others in his unit. On Veterans Day 2014, we dedicated the 100-block of Sea Isle's 46th Street to Corporal Crescenz's memory – and I am very happy that his spirit will live on and continue to inspire others in his home town of Philadelphia. Heroes like Michael don't come along every day.

CITY COUNCIL'S MESSAGE:

At the start of the April 12 City Council meeting, Council passed Resolution 076, which officially recognized Villanova University for winning the 2016 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The resolution stated that many residents and visitors in Sea Isle City are proud alumni of the esteemed learning institution – including two current members of City Council, one a 1955 graduate and one a 1962 graduate. The City Clerk will forward Resolution 076 to Villanova's Head Coach and Athletic Director so the Wildcats can be aware that Sea Isle City acknowledges their fine achievement.

Also on April 12, all Resolutions on the Consent Agenda were approved, including:

- Resolution 066, which authorizes a professional services contract with EMS Consulting Services, of Hammonton, NJ, for \$7500. This contract will provide the City with a thorough analysis of our Volunteer Ambulance Corps, and thus will help City leaders ensure that sufficient emergency medical services are provided to our residents and visitors for years to come.
- Resolution 067 authorized the extension of a concession contract with The Tower Optical Company, Inc., of Norwalk, CT, which provides the City with two coin-operated binoculars, one located on the Promenade at JFK Boulevard and the other at the Municipal Marina.
- Resolution 069 authorized professional service contracts with the various vendors who will run this year's summer recreation camps and clinics.
- Resolution 070 authorized the City to file a 2015 Tonnage / Recycling Report with the State of New Jersey. Because Sea Isle City once again recycled more than the minimum required amount of recyclable materials last year, our Municipality is eligible for a State "tonnage grant."
- Resolution 072 authorized a Place-to-Place Transfer (Extension of Premises) for Braca Café, which will allow the popular business to expand their outdoor "Henri's Bar" by utilizing an adjacent parcel on Pleasure Avenue. Now that Resolution 072 has been passed, site plan approval is required by the Planning Board if the Braca project is to move forward.

Our next City Council meeting is April 26 at 10:00 a.m. inside Council Chambers. We hope to see you there!

PROJECT UPDATES:

Beach Replenishment:

Additional refilling of beaches eroded by recent storms is in progress, with work completed from 25th to 51st Street. The dredge has again been moved to safe harbor in anticipation of rough seas over the next few days, with beach fill work expected to resume this coming weekend or early next week. The refill project will continue southward to 57th Street, and is expected to be completed within the next two weeks. In addition, dune fence and beach crossovers damaged by storms will also be repaired.

Utility Reconstruction, 36th & 37th Streets (fall 2015 construction):

On March 26, 2015 the council awarded a bid to Garden State General Construction in the amount of \$431,353.40 for the utility reconstruction of 36th Street & 37th Street from Cini Street to Landis Avenue. As of this date all work has been completed. Due to the inclement weather over the winter the area did not have sufficient time to settle, therefore, the City will reconstruct the streets in early fall.

Utility Reconstruction, various streets:

On October 27, 2015 the council awarded a bid to RTW Construction of Southamptton, New Jersey in the amount of \$744,713 for utility reconstruction at the following locations:

- 47th Street from Landis Avenue to Promenade – underway
- 49th Street from Landis Avenue to Promenade-underway
- 65th Street from Landis Avenue to Central Avenue
- 65th Street from Landis Avenue to Pleasure Avenue – substantially completed
- 69th Street from Landis Avenue to Central Avenue
- 76th Street from Landis Avenue to Pleasure Avenue

Work to install new sanitary main, sanitary laterals, new water main and water services on 47th is substantially completed. Work to install new water main & sanitary main, sanitary laterals and water services on 49th is

nearing completion. Sanitary main with new laterals completed on 65th from Pleasure Avenue to Landis Avenue. Initial work to install new water main on 69th is completed. As the new water mains pass various testing, work will continue to progress to reconstruct water services and sewer laterals to the individual homes on those streets. Water testing of new mains is in progress.

Roadway reconstruction program – various streets:

On March 15, 2016, City Council awarded a bid to Ricky Slade Construction, Inc. of Bridgeton New Jersey in the amount of \$299,437.50 for road reconstruction at the following locations:

- 44th Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade
- 46th Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade
- 56th Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade
- Roadway elevation on selected areas of 44th Street and Venicean Road

This project is slated to be completed before the summer season, however, the contract includes a suspension notice that no work can be done from mid-June until September 16, 2016. Storm sewer improvements on all streets are completed. ADA improvements to sidewalks and curb replacements are under way. Reconstruction of the asphalt streets will begin in the coming week.

Bulkhead Construction, 80th Street and 93rd Street:

On August 25, 2015 City Council awarded a contract to Colonnelli Brothers, Inc. of Hackensack, New Jersey in the amount of \$199,880 for the construction of bulkheads at the above locations. Larsen Marine, Inc. has been hired as a subcontractor. After some delays, the mobilization of this project occurred on March 15. The 93rd Street location is 75% completed. Concrete and roadway restoration will begin after sufficient settlement time has elapsed. The completion date of this contract has been extended to April 29, 2016.

Sea Isle Boulevard:

The Cape May County Board of Chosen Freeholders, at their May 13, 2014 meeting, awarded a \$12.7 million contract to South State, Inc. for the Sea Isle Boulevard Improvement project that will raise the roadway by approximately 4.5 feet and otherwise reconstruct Sea Isle Boulevard.

Traffic has been diverted to the south side of the boulevard; and the contractor has placed fill on the north side of the causeway to an average height of about 6.5 feet, which is 2 feet higher than the eventual height of the completed roadway. The additional 2 feet, which will be removed prior to the next construction phase, is surcharge to compress the underlying layers of soil. The goal is to obtain as much settlement as possible prior to paving on top of the new fill. The current plan is to start paving of the north side this coming fall.

Prior to the coming summer season, the entrance to the northbound parkway will be reconfigured in order to provide room for eastbound vehicles to travel around vehicles making a left turn onto the parkway entrance.

Motorists are advised to be aware of the revised traffic patterns in the construction zone and the reduced speed limit.

Streetscape Improvement on Landis Avenue:

On September 8, 2015 council awarded a bid to Think Pavers Hardscaping of Swedesboro, NJ in the amount of \$796,648.33 for streetscape improvements on Landis Avenue from 43rd Street to 39th Street. This project includes various aspects of beautification which includes new sidewalks, paver crosswalks, traffic striping, lighting, sod, stone mulching, various tree plantings & tree grates, benches and bike racks. The block from JFK to 40th was previously completed as part of the JFK Gateway Project.

Hardscape improvements and lighting improvements from 39th Street to 40th Street are completed, both east and west sides of Landis, as is the new crosswalk at 39th & Landis. Street tree installation will take place in the next several weeks.

The Contractor has substantially completed work south of JFK Boulevard on the west and east sides of Landis. Tree installation is under way. Paver installation will be completed by Friday afternoon. Once both sides of Landis are completed to 43rd Street, crosswalks at 42nd & West Jersey Avenue will be constructed. In order to complete the streetscape intersections, closing of the northbound and southbound lanes of Landis Avenue from JFK to 43rd Street will be necessary between April 14 and April 29. Detour signs will guide the motorists around the construction zone. Sidewalks in these blocks will remain open to pedestrian traffic. Notification and coordination with adjacent residents and businesses will take place in advance.

Public Works Maintenance Garage – 80th Street & Central:

On March 23, 2016 council awarded a bid to Archetto Construction of Vineland, NJ to replace the roof, siding and insulation at this location. Work will commence once all permits are in place and materials have been secured.

Sea Isle Ambulance Corps Building:

On November 18, 2015 a bid was accepted from Baruffi, Bros. Inc. of Vineland for needed stucco work to the exterior of the volunteer ambulance corps building in the amount of \$9,975. Due to the need for warmer weather conditions, work did not begin until April 8, 2016; and is progressing as weather permits. The Public Works Department is also doing exterior improvements to the garage door surrounds; sanding and painting exterior doors; and necessary interior repairs to this facility.

Townsend Inlet Bridge:

The TI Bridge was opened to traffic prior to Polar Bear Plunge Weekend, and remains open.

MASTER PLAN RE-EXAMINATION:

The public is invited to a Special Planning Board meeting on Monday, April 18, at 7:00 p.m. in City Hall, 233 JFK Boulevard. The meeting's discussion topics will be: Economic Development, Infrastructure and the Environment. This is expected to be the last Special Planning Board meeting prior to a Master Plan Re-Examination Report being drafted and reviewed later this year.

ROADWORK BETWEEN STRATHMERE & SEA ISLE:

Please be aware that roadwork is taking place along the Ocean Drive (Commonwealth Avenue) between Sea Isle City and Strathmere (Sea Isle's neighbor to the north). Please allow yourself extra time and drive cautiously when traveling between Sea Isle and Strathmere.

FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING:

During the months of April and May, Sea Isle City's Water Department will flush-out fire hydrants throughout town. Annual hydrant flushing is required by State law and ensures that hydrant systems are functioning properly (thus providing adequate water flow when needed). Residents can expect very little disruption in their water service - if any. However, low water pressure and possible water discoloration may occur. TRASH & RECYCLING INFO:

Curbside trash and recycling collections currently take place once each week on the following streets:

1st to 44th Street = Wednesdays

45th to 70th Street = Mondays

71st to 94th Street = Tuesdays

Don't Forget: The City will not collect carpeting or other construction materials, propane tanks, tires or batteries. Sea Isle City is a Single Stream Recycling Community, which means residents can combine all of their recyclable materials (paper, cans, glass and plastics) in one curbside collection bin. Recycling is not just a good idea...it's the law in Sea Isle City.

Sea Isle City's Trash and Recycling Depot, located next to the Bridge on JFK Boulevard, is open seven days a week (7:15 a.m. - 2:45 p.m.). The Depot will be closed on holidays (except New Year's Day, Presidents Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day and Labor Day). The Depot will accept drop-offs of trash and recycling, however Bulk Trash is not accepted at that location. **Free Refrigerator Magnets** with a complete list of Sea Isle City's year-round trash and recycling information are now available at the Public Works Building, 3905 Central Avenue, and at the Welcome Center, 300 JFK Boulevard.
