### **MAYOR'S MESSAGE:**

Sea Isle City's 2016 Patriot Day Ceremony had a huge turn-out of residents and visitors. It is reassuring to know that our nation will never forget the terrorist attacks that took place on September 11, 2001 – or the nearly 3000 people who were killed that day. As was noted during our ceremony, the terrorists thought they could break the American spirit and drive a wedge of fear into our society that would allow them to separate and conquer us – how wrong they were!

I'd like to thank each of the dignitaries who participated in this year's Patriot Day Ceremony, including the members of City Council, Deacon Liam O'Clisham, veteran Bill Johnson, VFW Post 1963 Commander Chick Haines and the VFW Color Guard, County Clerk Rita Marie Fulginiti, trumpeter Forrest Wan and the other members of Boy Scout Troop 76, Miss New Jersey National Teenager Shannon McCool, and Henrietta Creighton, who sang an uplifting version of *God Bless America*. My thanks also go to all of our police officers, volunteer firefighters, and volunteer ambulance corps members, who are there for us 365 days a year.

During Tuesday's City Council meeting, Cape May County Engineer Dale Foster and Engineer Paul Nolan, from Maser Consulting, explained in detail the road elevation project that's currently taking place along the Sea Isle Boulevard Causeway. As we move toward the second phase of that important project, which is expected to get underway very soon, I'd like to express my thanks to everyone for their patience as this significant infrastructure effort continues. As I have said many times before, Sea Isle City does not shut-down after Labor Day. No doubt you are aware that September is an ideal month to be here – not just because the weather is amazing, but also because there is no shortage of events that will keep your family entertained. For example, this weekend, September 17 & 18, the City's Division of Tourism will host Fall Family Festival, which is one of our largest events of the year. Fall Festival features two-days of entertainment and activities, including hundreds of merchandise vendors, a food court, free amusement rides and other fun on Saturday, and an antique auto show, live music and free trolley tours on Sunday. Then, later this month, don't miss Sea Isle's annual Irish Festival Weekend on September 23, 24 & 25, when there will be live Irish music, dancing, an Irish Vendors Market and plenty of cheerful folks who will be "wearin' the green."

If you can be in town on Thursday, September 22, please join us as we cheer-on the participants of the 2016 New Jersey "Run For The Fallen," which is a non-competitive run from Cape May to North

Jersey held in honor of all the men and women from the Garden State who died for our nation. At approximately 2:00 p.m. on that day, a team of active duty military members will enter Sea Isle City from Avalon and continue running north on The Ocean Drive (Landis Avenue). Along the way, they will stop at several “Hero Markers,” each of which will be devoted to a different New Jersey service member who was killed in action. To learn more about this event, read the “Run For The Fallen” section of this newsletter, where you can learn the specific times the runners are expected to be at each Hero Marker and the fallen warriors who will be honored that day. I hope to see you on September 22!

### **CITY COUNCIL’S MESSAGE:**

The members of City Council and Mayor Desiderio have received numerous emails and phone calls from property owners regarding the proposed Promenade Extension. Additionally, the City’s Administration recently contacted the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to get their input about that project. During the September 13 City Council meeting, the Mayor announced that there is now a joint understanding not to proceed with the Promenade Extension.

Also during the September 13 Council meeting, Cape May County Engineer Dale Foster and Engineer Paul Nolan, from Maser Consulting, gave a Power Point Presentation about the Sea Isle Boulevard causeway construction project. Phase 2 of that project is expected to begin in the days ahead.

Ordinance 1595 was introduced and had first reading on September 13. This ordinance relates to the adoption of Sea Isle’s Watershed Management Plan, which was developed in 2016 and supports the City’s continuing efforts to reduce flood insurance costs by participating in FEMA’s CRS Program.

During the “Pending Business” portion of the September 13 meeting, Councilwoman Tighe asked the City to meet with Uber once again to see if any existing issues with Uber drivers operating in Sea Isle City can be resolved.

During “New Business” on September 13, there was a discussion about the challenges associated with people launching kayaks at the Municipal Marina boat ramp. Councilman Gibson asked the Administration to determine if there are safer launch sites for kayakers. Councilman Gibson also asked the Administration to explore the idea of building an above-ground parking garage in town, possibly near the Municipal Marina.

City Council’s next meeting will take place on Tuesday, September 27, in City Hall – we hope to see you there!

## **MASTER PLAN RE-EXAMINATION UPDATE:**

The Planning Board held a Master Plan Re-Examination Public Hearing on September 12 in City Hall. That meeting, which was attended by approximately 100 audience members, lasted nearly 2.5 hours. During the meeting, Maser Consulting gave a Power Point Presentation. The focus of that presentation was the 42 recommendations the Planning Board has made as a result of the re-examination process. Maser also explained why cities create Master Plans, the process used during Sea Isle's current Master Plan Re-Examination, and the areas of concentration within the current Re-Examination.

There was considerable citizen feedback during the September 12 meeting, so it was decided the public hearing would be continued to the next Planning Board meeting on Tuesday, October 11, at 7:00 p.m. in City Hall. At that time, the Planning Board will focus on the citizen feedback that was collected during the September 12 meeting. The public is encouraged to attend the Planning Board's Public Hearing on October 11.

As a reminder, a draft of the Master Plan Re-Examination is available for public viewing on the home page of the City's website.

## **PROJECT UPDATES:**

### **Utility Reconstruction, 36<sup>th</sup> & 37<sup>th</sup> Streets:**

On March 26, 2015, City Council awarded a bid to Garden State General Construction in the amount of \$431,353.40 for the utility reconstruction of 36<sup>th</sup> Street & 37<sup>th</sup> Street from Cini Street to Landis Avenue. As of this date all work has been completed. Due to the inclement weather over the winter the area did not have sufficient time to settle, therefore, the City will reconstruct the streets in early fall of 2016.

### **Utility Reconstruction, various streets:**

On October 27, 2015, City Council awarded a bid to RTW Construction of Southampton, New Jersey, in the amount of \$744,713 for utility reconstruction at the following locations:

- 47<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Promenade – substantially completed.
- 49<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Promenade – substantially completed.
- 65<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Central Avenue – held until fall.
- 65<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Pleasure Avenue – substantially completed.
- 69<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Central Avenue – substantially completed.
- 76<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Pleasure Avenue – substantially completed.

Work to install new sanitary main, sanitary laterals, new water main and water services on 47<sup>th</sup>, 49<sup>th</sup>, and 65<sup>th</sup> from Landis to Pleasure and 69<sup>th</sup> Street is completed. All uncompleted work will resume in the fall including paving.

### **Roadway reconstruction program – various streets:**

On March 15, 2016, City Council awarded a bid to Ricky Slade Construction, Inc. of Bridgeton New Jersey in the amount of \$299,437.50 for road reconstruction at the following locations:

- 44<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade – completed
  - 46<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade – completed
  - 56<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade – completed
  - Roadway elevation on selected areas of 44<sup>th</sup> Street and Venicean Road – completed
- Project is being closed out.

### **Sea Isle Boulevard:**

The Cape May County Board of Chosen Freeholders, at their May 13, 2014 meeting, awarded a \$12.7 million contract to South State, Inc. for the Sea Isle Boulevard Improvement Project that will raise the roadway by approximately 4.5-feet and otherwise reconstruct Sea Isle Boulevard.

Traffic has been diverted to the south side of the boulevard, and the contractor has placed fill on the north side of the causeway to an average height of about 6.5-feet, which is 2-feet higher than the eventual height of the completed roadway. The additional 2-feet, which will be removed prior to the next construction phase, is surcharge to compress the underlying layers of soil. The goal is to obtain as much settlement as possible prior to paving on top of the new fill. The current plan is to start paving of the north side this coming fall.

The entrance to the northbound parkway has been reconfigured in order to provide room for eastbound vehicles to travel around vehicles making a left turn onto the parkway entrance. Motorists are advised to be aware of the revised traffic patterns in the construction zone and the reduced speed limit.

On September 13, at the City Council meeting, County Engineer Dale Foster led a presentation updating Council and the public about the project and upcoming schedule of activities. ### **Streetscape Improvement on Landis Avenue:**

On September 8, 2015, City Council awarded a bid to Think Pavers Hardscaping of Swedesboro, NJ, in the amount of \$796,648.33 for streetscape improvements on Landis Avenue from 43<sup>rd</sup> Street to 39<sup>th</sup> Street. This project includes various aspects of beautification which includes new sidewalks, paver crosswalks, traffic striping, lighting, sod, stone mulching, various tree plantings & tree grates, benches and bike racks. The block from JFK to 40<sup>th</sup> was previously completed as part of the JFK Gateway Project. Punch list items are being completed and Landis Avenue is now open to all vehicular traffic.

### **Public Works Maintenance Garage – 80<sup>th</sup> Street & Central:**

On March 23, 2016, City Council awarded a bid to Archetto Construction, of Vineland, NJ, to replace the roof, siding and insulation at this location. Finishing touches are occurring on this project including punch list items. Final completion is expected in the next few weeks. The maintenance department continues to work out of this location.

### **Venicean Road Check Valve:**

On April 26, 2016 City Council awarded a bid to RTW Construction, Inc., of Southampton, NJ, in the amount of \$67,590.00 for the Venicean Road Check Valve Chamber Installation. The work for this project is currently suspended for the summer and will commence later this month.

### **Storm Sewer Improvements-Kneass Street:**

On July 12, 2016, City Council awarded a bid to Garden State Construction of Clermont, NJ in the amount of \$414,903.69 for the Storm Sewer Improvement, Kneass Street drainage area. As of this newsletter, work has not begun but is anticipated to start later this month.

### **Sea Isle Branch – Cape May County Library:**

The Department of Public Works, in conjunction with the County Library System, Environmental Commission and the Shade Tree Committee, has been working hard to enhance the landscaping at the 4800 Park Road site. This included parking lot and walkway improvements, grading, irrigation, sod, landscaping and trees. Also included were two Terrapin gardens for nesting purposes. Signage is on order to explain their nesting habits including “fun facts.” This portion was in cooperation with Cameron Day of Sea Isle Boy Scout Troop 76 for his Eagle Project. Public Works employees and Cameron cooperated with the Historical Museum to redo

the memorial garden which includes a new water feature, enhancements to the landscaping and restoration of the mast and statue.

### **PROTECTED BEACHES AFTER LABOR DAY:**

The Sea Isle City Beach Patrol is currently operating with a reduced staff. During weekends in September, Lifeguards are scheduled to be in attendance on the following beaches:

**Saturday & Sunday, September 17 & 18:** 34th, 40th, 51st, 59th, 64th, 75th, 81st, and 86th Streets.

**Saturday & Sunday, September 24 & 25:** The Daytime Response Team will be stationed at Beach Patrol Headquarters and there may also be several lifeguard stands opened (dependent upon the availability of guards).

If you want to confirm which beaches will have lifeguards on duty before you go to the beach, phone the Beach Patrol at 609-263-3655. Remember: Only go in the ocean on a beach where a lifeguard is on duty! For more info about beach safety, visit [www.sicbp.com](http://www.sicbp.com).

### **RUN FOR THE FALLEN IN SEA ISLE SEPTEMBER 22**

On Thursday, September 22, runners from the 2016 "New Jersey Run For The Fallen" will pass through Sea Isle City as they honor every service member from the Garden State who has made the ultimate sacrifice for our nation's freedom. Please be on hand to cheer-on a patriotic group of active duty military personnel as they run along Landis Avenue during their 190-mile journey from Cape May to the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Holmdel, Monmouth County. The runners will enter Sea Isle City from Avalon via the Townsend Inlet Bridge at approximately 2:10 p.m. on September 22. As they continue running north on Landis Avenue, they will stop at four "Hero Markers," each of which will be dedicated to a deceased warrior from New Jersey and their Gold Star Family. At each Hero Marker, the runners will stop, read a brief biography, place a flag, salute, and then continue running north on Landis Avenue. The Hero Marker locations, the estimated times the runners will arrival at each marker, and the designated Fallen Warriors who will be honored at each marker are:

- 89<sup>th</sup> Street and Landis Avenue: 2:17 p.m.; in honor of PO1 David M. Tapper
- 64<sup>th</sup> Street and Landis Avenue: 2:30 p.m.; in honor of CW2 Nicholas P. DiMona II
- JFK Boulevard at the Promenade: 2:43 p.m.; in honor of SPC Adam D. Froelich & SPC Anthony J. Dixon
- 24<sup>th</sup> Street and Landis Avenue: 2:56 p.m.; in honor of LCpl Jeremy Kane.

The public is invited to be on hand at each Hero Marker and all along Landis Avenue on September 22 as the runners pass through Sea Isle City on their memorial trail through New Jersey. As always, a **City-Wide Bulk Trash Collection** takes place on the 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday in September (September 22, 2016)

**Don't Forget:** The City will not collect carpeting or other construction materials, propane tanks, tires or batteries. Sea Isle City is a Single Stream Recycling Community, which means residents can combine all of their recyclable materials (paper, cans, glass and plastics) in one curbside collection bin. Recycling is not just a good idea...it's the law in Sea Isle City.

**Sea Isle City's Trash and Recycling Depot**, located next to the Bridge on JFK Boulevard, is open seven days a week (7:15 a.m. - 2:45 p.m.). The Depot will be closed on holidays (except New Year's Day, Presidents Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day and Labor Day). The Depot will accept drop-offs of trash and recycling, however Bulk Trash is not accepted at that location. **Free Refrigerator Magnets** with a complete list of Sea Isle City's year-round trash and recycling information are now available at the Public Works Building, 3905 Central Avenue, and at the Welcome Center, 300 JFK Boulevard.
